## SENATE RESOLUTION No. 1711

A RESOLUTION honoring Michael Young for his outstanding work and contribution to our state as a talented artist and proud Kansas native.

WHEREAS, Michael Young is the visionary behind the remarkable *Brown v. Board of Education* mural, one of the most admired artworks on the Kansas Capitol tour; and

WHEREAS, Through his creativity and dedication, Michael Young brilliantly captured the significance of this pivotal moment in history, reminding us of Kansas' commitment to justice and equality; and

WHEREAS, The mural serves as a striking visual representation of progress and a powerful tool to spark meaningful conversations about civil rights; and

WHEREAS, *Brown v. Board of Education of Topeka, Kansas*, stands as a landmark United States Supreme Court case that declared racial segregation in public schools unconstitutional and affirmed that segregation violates the Equal Protection Clause of the 14<sup>th</sup> Amendment of the Constitution of the United States; and

WHEREAS, The *Brown v. Board of Education* landmark decision in 1954 became a monumental step in the fight for civil rights; and

WHEREAS, Kansas has been a leading voice in the struggle for civil rights since it entered the Union as a "free state" in 1861: Now, therefore,

*Be it resolved by the Senate of the State of Kansas:* That we honor Michael Young for his outstanding work and contribution to our state as a talented artist and proud Kansas native; and

*Be it further resolved:* That the Secretary of the Senate shall send enrolled copies of this resolution to Michael Young and Senator Klemp.
